In 2008 The Seahorse Trust changed the law to ensure British Seahorses were protected under the Wildlife and Countryside Act.

It is now illegal to take them from the wild and you must consider seahorses in any planning application at sea.

During 2019 after 10 years of research, study and lobbying the authorities we finally managed, after the third attempt to get Studland Bay in Dorset made into a Marine Conservation Zone. Working with our partners we now hope to restore this site back to favouable conditions to allow seahorses to return.





The Seahorse Trust works with partners from over 30 countries around the world and with many governments to ensure seahorses are protected and we can know more about them. Only by working in true partnership with so many people and organisations can we make a difference.
