



REUSABLE MILK CONTAINER PLANTER










In the spirng you will get a small sapling. Leave it in this container and during the second winter once the leaves have dropped off, then plant it out into the wild. Clean out and wash, with a mild detergent the container and use it again for the next lot of seeds. You can use the containers for years to come and it is a great way of reccyling your milk containers

If space is short, or you just want to grow lots of saplings then why not make a rack for them or hang them on a wall.

The handle of the container is great to put a rod through or a piece of rope so you can hang the container up.

Vertical planting is a great way to save space and you can also grow a green wall using this system by planting lots of plant species such as ivy and ferns.


